Missions

Richard Crane is the Mission to the World liaison to Cuba. The pandemic has slowed the momentum the Cranes had built in training counselors in Cuba. Richard misses the in-person gatherings they had when they could travel to Cuba, but technology has allowed him to continue his ministry from home. He has been able to create and conduct courses for the master's program in counseling, and to counsel and mentor people in Cuba, Africa, the U.S. and Latin America.

Richard continues to mentor some graduates of the counseling program that now serve as teachers themselves and church planters in Havana. Thanks to donations they received, the Cranes were able to send electronic equipment to them so they could develop a significant virtual ministry. They've been able to conduct virtual worship services, preaching, Bible studies and prayer meetings during the pandemic. The Cranes would appreciate prayer for the following:

- safety for many Christians in Cuba who are boldly countering false statements circulating regarding the faith... may their concerns be heard and make a difference
- encouragement for pastors, who after investing time in training leaders, are seeing many of them leave the country
- for the preparation of two Intro to Counseling courses and a ramping up of ministry in Cuba
