David Green is the former Mid-Atlantic Coordinator for Reformed University Fellowship (RUF). When he and his wife Ruth left RUF in January 2021, many people made suggestions about their next ministry. Since then they have felt increasingly drawn to serving with a mission team in Southeast Asia, training campus ministers and establishing new campus ministries throughout the region. The following is a recap of what they have done over the past year and a half:

Step 1: Ask tons of questions

Step 2: Talk with team members in person

Step 3: Tests and interviews to determine suitability for cross-cultural ministry

Step 4: Visit the place to evaluate their prospects for success

Step 5: Join a support organization

Step 6: Last month their presbytery voted to approve their call to serve in Southeast Asia

They have been seeking God's will along the way, and He appears to be opening doors so far. Two big remaining steps include raising support to fund the ministry and making arrangements to move there, possibly by next summer.
