## *Missions*


Shibu Oommen and his wife Mary have transitioned from his being Assistant Pastor at Crossroads Community Presbyterian Church in Upper Darby to a Trainer/Coordinator for Evangelism Explosion (EE) in the Tristate Area.

During the pandemic, EE has developed online training sessions through Webinar and Zoom. They have also been creative with their new gospel tract; it includes a reusable face mask and says, "The mask helps to save you from COVID death, and the tract helps to save you from eternal death."

Shibu continues his ministry with the S3 (Seek, Share, Serve) street evangelism group in Upper Darby. After 8 weeks of quarantine, they decided to do a pilot run back on the street, making sure to wear masks and gloves. They had an opportunity to carry on some fruitful conversations with a few Muslim men who were open to receiving Arab gospel tracts. They are praising God for two other men who prayed to receive Christ as Savior. The S3 group returned to the street again the following weekend where three people made professions of faith, fruitful conversations happened and gospels of John in English, Spanish and Arabic were received by many.

Please pray that the Holy Spirit would open the hearts of these people as they read God's word, and that those who prayed to receive Christ as Savior would continue to grow in their faith.
