
Missions

Flavien and Inyange serve in sensitive countries where they focus on mentoring other missionaries and aiding indigenous church planting. Due to the pandemic and the inability of the church leaders in Senegal to meet and make official decisions, plans for the seminary there have not been formalized. Flavien continues to plan though, working with potential instructors to prepare their courses and networking and mobilizing partners in the US and Europe. Unfortunately the seminary does not have the ability to conduct online learning as too many students lack internet access. The plan is for Flavien to go and teach a course as soon as it is possible to travel and meet again.

In the meantime, he has been busy working on publishing projects of various kinds and on a research paper that he is to present at the Evangelical Theological Society meeting in November. Please pray that he would make good progress on the paper and on a translation of The Westminster Larger Catechism.

Despite less-than-ideal circumstances, Flavien is happy to report that all their children finished the school year well. His family is thankful for their large garden that has enabled them to enjoy the outdoors during the pandemic. Please pray for them as they navigate many unknowns related to their children's education in the fall. Flavien also asks for prayer for his mother in France who is facing some serious health issues and must soon make difficult treatment decisions.
